

OURBEHAVIOUR



The Good Help Way

Children at our school learn through our 3 rules: **respectful, proud, safe**. We respect others by showing kindness to one another and looking after our school property; we take pride in our work by doing our best and we celebrate others' success; we act safely around school so that we can enjoy the exciting activities we do.

Through R.E. and RSHE, children are taught from the beginning about the Gospel Values and being a good person; these messages are weaved into our wholeschool collective worships, celebrations and throughout our curriculum. We study books within English using a wide-range of quality texts which have diverse themes to allow the children to explore other cultures and listen to other view points.

We ensure children behave well by reinforcing positive behaviour. Our house system, implemented using Class Dojo, enables children to collect points for displaying desired behaviours. We use a range of weekly rewards such as 'Superstar' certificates accompanied by hot chocolate, 'Pride' awards, 'Above and Beyond' gold bands and our 'Special delivery' postcards, which are sent home to celebrate great attitudes to learning.

OUR CURRICULUM

An Overview

Our curriculum reflects our aspirations for the children of Our Lady of Good Help. It connects them to communities locally and throughout the world – reflecting our diversity. The broad and balanced content has been carefully selected to inspire and engage children. Throughout the curriculum, they will have the opportunity to explore, build knowledge, create and present their work: vital skills for a life of learning. By the time our children leave OLGH, we want them to be confident, articulate, knowledgeable, upstanding members of the community, ready to continue their learning journey.

From Reception, we teach the children to read through Read, Write inc. by Ruth Miskin. The books are carefully matched to their reading ability and, as they move through the scheme, they are carefully assessed and monitored to ensure they make excellent progress. Once they complete this programme, they are introduced to whole class reading where we build upon their skills by explicitly teaching them to predict, summarise, retrieve & infer information from texts and explore a wide range of high-level vocabulary.

In maths, we use a mastery approach to learning through Power Maths, which systematically builds knowledge and enables children to develop excellent reasoning skills. We also focus on basic maths skills: counting, times tables and arithmetic to ensure all children are confident, fluent mathematicians.

We encourage the children to be creative and knowledgeable across the whole curriculum and we aim to provide meaningful connections in their learning so that they can use these links to help them remember and do more as they progress through the school.

EXTRA-CURRICULAR

Our school places great importance on children developing their whole self through a range of sporting and arts activities. Our focus on wellbeing and participation to enahnce learning and enjoyment is key to our success. Children are rewarded for their commitment to extra-curricular activity through our house dojo system.

We provide a wide variety of clubs run by our staff and also some paid-for clubs run by external coaches. Clubs include dodgeball, cricket, football, netball, basketball, badminton, arts & crafts, computing, reading, choir, multi-sports, tennis, hockey, maths games, board games, TT Rockstars and many others throughout the year.

We promote healthy lifestyles by implementing an active playground. Our sports coach ensures many children are active at lunch time by providing a wide variety of activities including space-hopping and archery!
