



'Be cured!' And the leprosy left him at once and he was cured. Jesus immediately sent him away and sternly ordered him, 'Mind you say nothing to anyone, but go and show yourself to the priest, and make the offering for your healing prescribed by Moses as evidence of your recovery.' The man went away, but then started talking about it freely and telling the story everywhere, so that Jesus could no longer go openly into any town, but had to stay outside in places where nobody lived. Even so, people from all around would come to him.

What We've been learning...



Reception has been excited to be back in school and tell each other all about their holidays. They have worked hard in phonics lessons as usual. The children listened to the story of 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt' and acted out the story on the school grounds.

In maths, the children are working on numbers to ten and have been counting reliably using one to one correspondence. They were putting the correct amount of spots on butterflies to match the numeral. In communication and language sessions the children have been talking about what makes a good listener and then demonstrating this behaviour during whole class inputs.

What We've been learning...



Wow! What an amazing first week back in Y1. We have been working hard learning the poem 'Incy Wincy Spider.' We have been using adjectives to describe the spider and its web. In math, we have been learning about 10 and a bit more. We have thought about all the different ways 10 can be represented. In science, we are learning about materials. We completed an investigation to see which materials absorb water.

In geography, we have started a new topic about our local area. We learned that our school is located on South Drive, and we enjoyed looking at maps of our local area to see what we could find. We found out that there is a local church, park, and fish and chip shop around our school.





What we've been learning...



It has been a fantastic start to the new year in Y2! We have started our new topics and in English we have been learning about non-fiction biographies with the book Bold Women in Black History. For geography, we have started our topic by learning about how many continents are in the world and what they are called. Maths this week has been looking at lines of symmetry in shape and completing patterns with 2D shapes.

We have begun our new RE topic all about the importance of the Bible and we have been learning about the Gospels and how they are used in the parish family. Our collective worship has focused on God's family and what it means to be a part of it.



What We've been learning...

This week in maths, we have been learning all about multiplication. We have been great at calculating using related facts and reasoning about it also. In English, we have started the wonderful book The Magic Paintbrush. We have enjoyed learning about ancient China. In history, we have been learning about where and how cities grew up in the Indus Valley.

In RE, we have been exploring our own personal journeys that make we throughout year. has 11 been interesting reflecting on the key points that we encounter. In art, we have been learning how to create joins in preparation for creating **3D** our sculptures.

Welcome back to the spring term in year 5! We have had a very productive week. During our English lessons, we have been reading and analysing the poem 'The Highwayman'. In our RE lessons, we started a new topic about 'missions' and thought about how we could plan our own charity.

During maths, we have continued our fraction topic, where we have been adding mixed numbers and fractions. In geography, we have started a new topic about 'migration' and found out about someone who migrated from Northern Ireland to Liverpool (not Mr. McQuiston!). It was very interesting!



What We've been learning...



Well in such an important term ahead for our Year 6, the class have been really switched on and ready to learn this week. We have started our new English topic called Varmints. In maths, we are solving word problems using fractions of amounts using all four operations. We have started our new topic on migration in geography and have completed our Anglo-Saxon history topic.

In art, we used chiaroscuro techniques of using light and shading in charcoal to create a standout effect. In science, we are learning about electricity this term too. We have had a very busy week but a very enjoyable one at that. What a great start back, Year 6.
