What we've been learning...



Reception enjoyed expressing their creative skills in art when making bears, mark making and drawing turtles this week linked to our topic of 'Animals.' In English, they have been using their phonics skills in their writing. They were spelling CVC words linked to pictures from our story 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt.'

We have started a new topic in PE and the children negotiated space successfully and travelled backwards safely. There was some competitive spirit in the house teams during our games. In maths, the children have taken part in lots of different activities and shown that they are beginning to represent and write numbers to 10.





#OLGHY1

What we've been learning...



Y1 has been working really hard this week. In English, we have been exploring different features of a poem. We really enjoyed learning about rhyming words. We learned that they have the same end sound, but some are spelled differently, like 'peas' and 'cheese.' In maths, we learned that 17, 18, and 19 are made up of 1 ten and some ones using the '10 and a bit' structure.

In geography, we thought about where we live, emphasising the importance of knowing our address. We searched for our homes on Google Maps, which was so much fun, and then drew a picture, thinking about their features. In science, we learned about transparent and opaque materials. We used torches to see if the light would pass through the materials.





What we've been learning...



This week, we have been learning about the features in a biography and practicing using them in our sentences. We focused on the properties of 3D shapes in maths and how to create patterns with them. During geography this week, we have built on our learning from last week and added the 5 oceans to the world map of continents.

During art, we have been working with clay and began making pinch pots. Our focus in Re has been on the four gospels and how they are used by the parish family. While our collective worship has been looking at the story of how St Andrew met Jesus.



What we've been learning...



We have worked hard this week in maths to calculate multiplication of two digit numbers by 1 digit numbers. We have been good at using mathematical language. In English, we have been developing sentences to tell Shen's story in The Magic Paintbrush. We enjoyed sharing our vocabulary choices with others.

In RE, we have been learning about the Liturgical calendar, creating our own art to illustrate it. In music, we have been learning how to sing together, paying attention to the parts others. We enjoyed the song based on the Vikings. In art, we have been exploring joining techniques in preparation for creating our own abstract sculptures.



What we've been learning...



In maths this week, have continued our work on multiplication and division, using multiplication and division facts to answer questions. We are continuing our arithmetic skills, building on our times tables knowledge especially. In English, we building on our sentence are stacking.work based on the book Aladdin. We have used personification, dialogue, repetition for effect and singular and plural apostrophes.

In RE, we are learning about community and making links between God's call to the apostles and his call to us now. In geography, worked we have on transporting and depositing along the coastline. In science. have we investigated how sound travels. During our history topic, we have discussed Caratacus and his fight against the Romans.





What we've been learning...



What a wintry week at school! It was wonderful to hear how you had spent your snow day. On Monday, some of our children read prayers during mass with Father Colin. He spoke about the different kinds of invitations we receive in our lives. In our English lessons, we are continuing to study the poem, 'The Highwayman' and our writing has become extremely creative as we experiment with language.

Fractions have become our friends in Year 5 as we are now confidently adding and subtracting fractions with different denominators and even improper fractions and mixed numbers! We are enjoying our new science topic about forces, particularly investigating friction by attempting to move jelly that has been covered in oil or salt!



What we've been learning...



This week saw our first Mass of the year with Father Colin, which was a lovely way to start the week. In maths, we have learned how to find fractions of part and whole amounts meanwhile in English, we have been working very hard on our sentence structure on our new book called, Varmints.


