





What We've been learning...



Reception has been learning about 'Palm Sunday' in RE this week. They talked about how Jesus rode into Jerusalem on a donkey. People were happy to see Jesus and shouted 'Hosanna.' They acted out the scripture, made hearts with playdough to show His love for us and made paper palm leaves to wave.

In maths this week, the children have been recognising patterns and took part in lots of practical activities. They then continued the pattern they could see and are beginning to make their own patterns.

What We've been learning...



This week, we welcomed some visitors into our class to showcase all the amazing work we have been doing in RE. They were very impressed with our knowledge of the gospel story 'The Widow's Mite'. We reflected on how we can be more giving and decided to make some offering purses. We contemplated the power of giving and the difference it can make in people's lives.

In English, we have started a new poetry topic focused on the five senses. We went on a nature walk, engaging our senses to explore what we could smell, hear, taste, touch, and see. We then created a word bank of descriptive words to use in our poems. In geography, we learnt about Northern Ireland. We discovered that the capital city is Belfast and learned about various landmarks, local cuisine, and celebrations.

What We've been learning...



This week in RE, we have been looking at the important events that happen during Holy week, including Palm Sunday and Maundy Thursday. Our special visitors in school where amazed with our descriptions and how much writing we were able to do. We have also used the scripture from the bible to consider how we can make sacrifices just as Jesus did during our Prayer and Liturgy.

As part of our music lesson this week, we discussed the meaning of the words dynamics and tempo and used these to discuss making our own pieces of music. We also had one of our own class members bring their string instrument in and play it for us. We were amazed at his skill! During science, we have continued learning about habitats and we were able to decide which animals lived in each habitat by thinking about how it fit their needs.

In English, we have been planning our non-fiction writing for our imaginary animal that we have created. We have such good imaginations! In maths we have been developing our understanding of what fractions make a whole.

Our children have been thinking about what we should be doing for others during Lent in RE this week. It has also been great to see our drawings that relayed what made up a city-state in ancient Greece..

What We've been learning...



Another wonderful week in Year 4 this week. We have had some visitors in school and it was great to show them all the great things in our class and our school. In maths this week, we are continuing our work on fractions, this has included finding fractions in their simplest form as well as adding fractions and mixed numbers. In English, we have continued our work on SPaG and reading, as well as our narrative based on the book 'Float'.

In RE, we focussed on self-discipline and what we need to do during the time of Lent. We visited Childwall Woods and Fields and discussed the environment and things we can use in our own school environment. In PE, we focussed on small games of handball using our skills and tactics we have been learning throughout the weeks.

This week, we welcomed some RE visitors into our school. It was wonderful to be able to show them our books and talk to them about our Catholic ethos and what it means to us. We have really enjoyed our English lessons this week where we have started to learn about the incredible planet Mars.

In our RE lesson, we focused on the amazing sacrifice that Jesus made on the cross. We thought about famous Christians who have used Jesus' example to transform their lives and to live with hope and faith. In our science lessons this week, we learnt about the life cycle of a chicken. Which do you think came first, the chicken or the egg?

This week started with a lovely Mass from Fr Colin. This has followed into our Prayer and Liturgy, where we have been learning about how we sacrifice for others and how we try to be the best we can be. In RE, we have been exploring how to cope with loss and relish new life. We then learnt how this links to Ash Wednesday.In English, we have been completing sentence structures for our adventure narrative meanwhile in maths we have been solving perimeter and area word problems.

In geography, we have been learning all about megacities in South America. We have explored the positives and negatives associated with densely populated cities. In science, we have learnt about how animals such as camels and giraffes (amongst many others) adapt to their environment. We have also enjoyed time in the annexe this week as well as PE and art this week – where we have made our own memory boxes.


